Our leading rusher for the night was Ryan Wixson 20 for 98 with two touchdowns 1 at 22 yds and 2 at 11yds.

Gus Tanner was our second leading rusher with 5 for 29 yds.

Jeremy Stapleton was 10 for 26yds. Jeremy also was 7 for 14 in passing attempts for 74 yds.

Other contributors to the offensive were Nick Long, Parker Nugent and Maurice Nash.

The offense amassed 154 yds on the ground with 44 attempts and completed passes yield 74 yards in the air for total offense of 228 yds. We also accumulated 12 first downs.

Defensively Ryan Wixson lead with 12 tackles followed by Nick Long with 8 and Daren Crawford with 6. Gavin Sauer helped us with a fumble recovery early in the first half.
