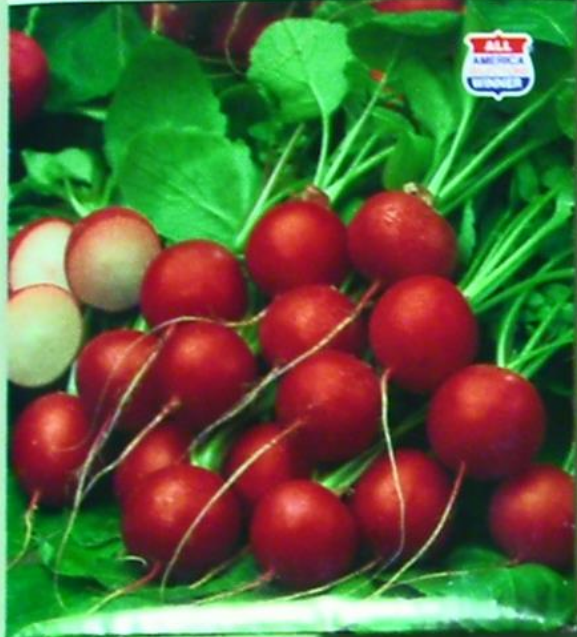

RADISH

(Ravanello)

CHERRY BELLE

Matures in 25 Days

These bright red Radishes are perfectly round and have pure white flesh of delightful flavor and crispness. Strong, short length tops make pickling easy. Roots remain firm long after picking.

SOWING... Plant seed outdoors as soon as the ground can be worked. Plant rows 12 inches apart, spacing seeds 1/2 inch apart in the row. Cover seed with 1/8 inch fine soil, well pressed down. Keep moist until plants start to grow.

THINNING... When plants are 1 to 2 inches tall, thin or transplant, spacing plants 2 inches apart.

GERMINATION... Germinates in 7 to 10 days depending on soil and weather conditions.

REMARKS... Radishes may be planted in the same row as slow growing kinds such as carrot or lettuce. To grow the best Radishes, the crop must grow quickly, therefore, the soil must be loose and enriched with fertilizer.





RADISH

Watermelon

Matures in 29 Days

This unusual radish looks like a watermelon when sliced. The round white roots have green shoulders and are 2 inches in diameter. The inside flesh is red to pink sweet and crisp. Large tops make for easy picking. Best when picked small.

SOWING... Plant seed outdoors as soon as the ground can be worked. Plant seeds 1/2 inch apart in rows 12 inches apart and cover with 1/8 inches of soil, well pressed down. Keep soil moist until seeds start to grow. For continuous harvest, plant every week through September.

THINNING... When plants are 1 to 2 inches tall, thin to 4 inches apart in the row.

GERMINATION... Germinates in 7 to 10 days depending on soil and temperature conditions.

REMARKS... To grow the best radishes the crop must grow quickly therefore the soil must be loose and enriched with fertilizer. Water in the absence of rain.



RADISH

Long White Icicle

Matures in 28 Days

One of the most easily grown home garden vegetables. This kind is the finest of all long radishes, pure white, crisp, tender and juicy. The roots grow 6 inches long and are the shape of an icicle.

SOWING... Plant seed outdoors as early in the Spring as ground can be worked. Plant in rows 12 inches apart, spacing seed 1/2 inch to 1 inch in the row. Cover seed with 1/4 inch of soil, well pressed down.

THINNING... When plants are 2 to 3 inches high, thin to 2 inches apart in the row.

GERMINATION... Germinates in 7 to 14 days depending on soil and temperature conditions.

REMARKS... Rich in vitamins A, B and C. Can be grown in the same row with Carrots, Parsley or Lettuce as they mature quickly and are out of the way for other crops. Make successive plantings at 2 week intervals.

SNAP PEAS

SUGAR ANN

DWARF - HEIGHT 1 1/2 FEET

Matures in 56 Days

Earlier and more dwarf than Sugar Snap, this popular variety can be used from immature stage until pods start to become netted. Strings in pods should be stripped out. They are at their best when pods are round and firm. Can be used raw in salads as well as cooked.

SOWING... Plant seed outdoors in March whenever weather allows. Plant seeds 1 1/2 inches apart in rows 2 1/2 feet apart. Cover seed with 2 inches of soil, well pressed down.

THINNING... When plants are 2 to 3 inches tall, thin to 3 inches apart.

GERMINATION... Germinates in 10 to 14 days depending on soil and temperature conditions.

REMARKS... This variety can be grown without support. Planting in double rows 6 inches apart will provide additional support where necessary. Make repeated plantings for continuous supply all season.

Matures in 60 Days

This popular early variety produces an abundance of dark green straight pods about 4 1/2 inches long. Each pod contains 6 to 8 large peas. This early summer favorite is highly resistant to fusarium wilt.

SOWING... Plant seed outdoors in March whenever weather allows. Plant seed 1 1/2 inches apart in rows 2 1/2 feet apart. Cover seed with 2 inches of soil, well pressed down.

THINNING... When plants are 2 to 3 inches tall, thin to 3 inches apart.

GERMINATION... Germinates in 10 to 14 days depending on soil and temperature conditions.

REMARKS... This variety can be grown without support. Planting in double rows 6 inches apart will provide additional support where necessary. Make repeated plantings for continuous supply all season.
